# Children's Message

#### **Invitation to Lent**

On Ash Wednesday we began our journey toward baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, a turning around of our lives, and for God's mercy.

We are created to experience joy in communion with God, living in the covenant we have in our baptism, we are called to love one another and to live in harmony with creation.

But our sinful rebellion keeps us from fully experiencing communion with God, our neighbors and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called into spiritual disciplines that contend against evil and resist whatever leads us away from love of God and love of neighbor. I invite you therefore to the discipline of Lent as we rediscover the spiritual practices that transform us.

Let us continue our journey together through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

## **New Testament Reading**

1 Peter 3:18-22

<sup>18</sup>Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, <sup>19</sup>in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, <sup>20</sup>who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. <sup>21</sup>And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, <sup>22</sup>who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

<sup>9</sup>In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup>And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. <sup>11</sup>And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." <sup>12</sup>And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. <sup>13</sup>He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. <sup>14</sup>Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, <sup>15</sup>and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."
